THINK WIDE(N) to prevent burglary



Our research shows two thirds (67%) of people are worried about their home being broken into, yet there are simple, proven measures we can all take to reduce our chances of becoming a victim of burglary by up to 50%.

To help you be and feel safer at home, we are running our THINK WIDE(N) burglary

prevention campaign (1st-31st March), highlighting the simple evidence-based WIDE measures which can be taken in any home on a variety of budgets.

At Neighbourhood Watch, we also believe neighbours keeping an eye out for each other is key to reducing burglary, so we've extended the WIDE acronym to WIDE(N):

- W: WINDOWS: Keep your windows locked
- I: INTERIOR: Put inside lights on a timer/ smart bulb
- D: DOORS: Double or deadlock your doors
- E: EXTERIOR: Put outside lights on a sensor
- (N): NEIGHBOURS: Keep an eye out for your neighbours



Neighbourhood Watch Community Grants Fund now OPEN

Applications for our Spring funding round are now open, closing on 31st March.

We want to help you kickstart, improve or expand your community work as part of Neighbourhood Watch.

For this round, 100% of available funds will go towards activities or one-off development projects that help your group or association promote and support Neighbourhood Watch's 40th Anniversary.

The size of grant you can apply for in the Spring round is between £100 - £250.

Groups can only hold one grant at a time and only hold one grant in each financial year. The grant will need to be spent by the year end of 2022.

Groups are defined as: schemes, areas, districts or associations, e.g. several schemes can hold grants within an association, and that association can also hold its own grant, but all projects or applications must be clearly defined and separate from each other.

Planning a street party?

Just a gentle reminder that now is the time to apply for a street closure with your council. Many councils are allowing this without charge, but please check when you are putting in your application.

NCSC WORKSHOPS WITH **NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH**

The National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC) ran two workshops with Neighbourhood Watch volunteers and members. The first was with general members and the second with Cyberhood Watch Ambassadors.



The workshops were well-received and NCSC want to continue working with our members as a way of testing, trialling and helping focus their work and resources for communities.

NCSC are very keen and focused on increasing the knowledge and conversations in communities about cybersecurity and cyber risks - an area of criminal activity increasing at huge rates. This aligns perfectly with our Cyberhood Watch initiative, and we have been working closely with NCSC on this for over 2 years. The work, skills and knowledge of our Cyberhood Watch Ambassadors will be a huge boost to this work. There are many great examples of Associations and Coordinators supporting and working closely with Ambassadors to enhance and improve Neighbourhood Watch's work and support to local communities.

THE LOOKOUT student magazine - Issue 2 out now


We are excited to share ISSUE 2 of our popular student safety magazine THE LOOKOUT.
